AGM2020/5 Chairman’s Report - Mark Hayes

Written Report received.

Firstly, I would like to thank all the members of the committee for their input, help and hard work during the year during which the YAA continued to support archery across the county. We held tournaments for all archery disciplines (Indoor, target, clout, field & longbow) across the year, continued to provide grants to YAA members selected for international representation, sent teams to the mid-summer team event at Lilleshall and the 5 counties junior and senior events in October, supported coaches and judges with grants as they advanced in grade.

We also made the decision to invest in equipment held by the county at Wetherby for use in tournaments by upgrading to foam bosses which due to their construction will proved to be more cost effective than straw bosses. The straw bosses were offered to YAA clubs at very competitive rates and were snapped up.

Once again I feel the need to highlight the important role of volunteers within our sport who are the bond which holds it together, the downturn in the number of people willing to help appears to continue. Archery now appears to rely on the same people at club, county and region levels which is very worrying and I encourage people to get involved and offer help.

Later in this AGM you will have to opportunity to get involved on behalf of Yorkshire archers (there are over 3000 of us!) this commitment covers 4 meeting per year and some help for a few hours at one of the 4 Wetherby days so please consider becoming a volunteer and help our sport by getting involved.

AGM 2020/7 Treasurer’s Report - Gwen Smith

Written Report received.

Year-end accounts as at 31/12/19 provided as separate document

The 2019 annual accounts have been validated by Mick Groves of Aardwolf Archers and I would like to thank Mick for his prompt endeavours and diligence.

The YAA invested heavily during 2019 for the benefit of Yorkshire archers and all archers who attend our organised tournaments. These investments included:

- replacement of the straw bosses for tournaments held at Wetherby by 35 new style foam ones
- re stock of representative medals bars which should last the county for the next 10 years
- refurbishment of both the container area at Wetherby and judges' radios for use at competitions
- funding mechanism for the YAA field tournament was reviewed and changed. The hosting club will now receive an honorarium from YAA of £300. All income from the shoot will be retained and expenditure covered by the hosting club
- Funding for YAA indoor shoot has been increased
- achievement grants have continued to be paid to archers, judges and coaches within the county.

As a result of these investments (particularly the boss replacement and medal bars) expenditure has been such that the running surplus of YAA accounts has been spent. Funds at this year end are below the level of one year running costs for the county.

Consisting of: £4558.25 Deposit account
£ 395.81 Current account
£114.20 Cash held by Officers

As at 31st December there were 15 cheques outstanding (total value £2064.40) and cheque deposits of £956.50 not showing on the bank statement. These are included in the current account figures above.

Balance sheet:

The balance sheet shows a total net income of £18596.97 and expenditure of £37887.36; this represents a net overspend of £19,290.39.

Income increased by £666.32 from 2018; mainly due to £2140.00 income from the sale of the YAA stock of straw bosses. Without the sale of boss's the accounts would show a decrease in real income of £1473.68.

Expenditure increased by £17799.34 from 2019; due to purchases of new foam bosses and restocking of medals and bars.

We currently hold stocks with a book value of £11963.50.

Income & Expenditure:

Income from subscription fees is down by £654.90 from the same time in 2018.

Money owed to YAA in respect of subscription fees shows a deficit which is largely due to single club which has outstanding fees. The GNAS and NCAS clout, administered by Andrew Neal through the YAA bank account has provided a net donation of £210.01 in 2019.

Sundry income includes £162 in entry fees for the 2020 indoor tournament.

1 cheque carried forward from YE2018 was not cashed and has been treated as a donation of £74.

Travelling expenses for YAA teams show an increase of £639.35 on 2018; this is partly as a result of the inclusion of barebow archers in the national team tournament.

Sundry expenditure represents an increase of £1194.11 over last year. All spend in this category over £120 is listed in the notes section of the accounts.

Tournament accounts:

Tournaments in 2019 show a net profit of £456.52 when looking at income and direct costs; when indirect costs (such as boss wear and medals) is considered there is a loss of £1959.88.

There is a couple of changes to the Tournament account spreadsheet this year:

- the YAA indoor entry fees, accounted for in 2018, have been added to the tournament account entry total. To ensure that the accounts for 2019 balance the same figure has been deducted in the 'additional income' field. This hopefully gives a more accurate measure of the indoor tournament income.
- An additional line of direct expenditure has been added to include the judges gift vouchers which are paid to judges at the end of the year for each attendance at a YAA shoot. Previously this figure was not included in the tournament accounts summary.

2020 proposed budget - See budget sheet.

The draft budget shows a potential shortfall of funds in the sum of £1360.00.

Assumptions:

Most income and expenditure is expected to remain similar to 2019 levels. Some increases have been added to cover inflation and expenditure decreases have been made where extraordinary spend was made in 2019 e.g. purchase of foam bosses.

It is expected the YAA members to remain similar to 2019.

A higher level of income from the tournaments is expected: in part due to the increase in entry fees for the outdoor tournaments held at Wetherby, but also income from the grand northern. I have been conservative in the income estimates in this area.

There will be no income or expenditure for bosses.

Expenditure of Medals & trophies is expected to reduce from the spends of 2018 and 2019 when large purchases of medals and bars were made to meet the needs of the next 10 years. A budget has been included to cover the cost of minor trophy refurbishments.

Sundry expenditure is expected to be lower than 2019, returning to the more normal levels of 2018. Some expenditure is expected to amend the stands to accommodate the new boss style.

Resolved The accounts for 2019 as presented were approved.

AGM 2020/7/1 Proposal for affiliation fees 2020 - 2021

I propose on behalf of the committee that to cover the expected shortfall in the YAA budget of £1360.00 we look to increase the affiliation fees for over 18's by £1 to £4 and Junior and archer with disability fees by 10p to 40p. This is in line with the committee resolution to maintain junior and disabled fees at 10% of senior.

The proposal will set the YAA 2020/21 fees at:

If agreed, based on 2019 member numbers, the fees increase will bring in an additional £1810.90, giving a surplus of £450.90. It is proposed university fees remain unchanged.

Kath Fitzpatrick asked if the increases as proposed would be large enough. The Treasurer replied that, based on the budget as presented, alongside one extra YAA Tournament (NCAS Grand Northern) in 2020, she believed the increase was large enough to deliver a small surplus. Discussion also held around retention, family members and costs, increase in beginner numbers and what fees other counties charge. It was believed the YAA Fees were some of the lowest fees across the country.

AGM2020/8 Officers Reports

AGM2020/8/1 County Coaching Organiser – Kath Fitzpatrick

Written Report received.

Coaching strength

The figures are based on the last census sent out by AGB which was in November 2019 and came with an inaccuracy health warning due to processing of both a high volume of renewals and also membership. Hence these are indicative rather than final figures.

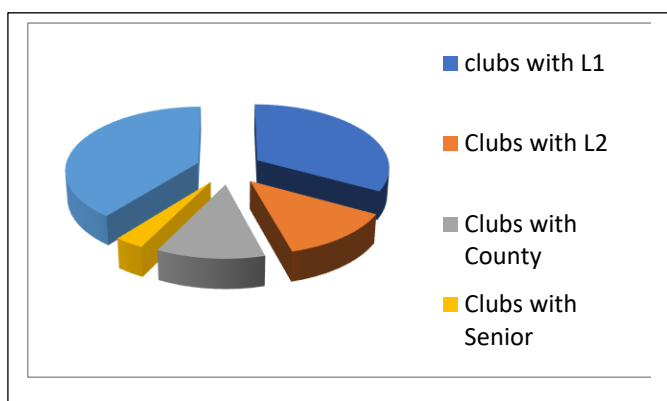
The figures show that overall numbers are down on 2019 – though this may change once accurate figures are released) however the increase of 5 at County level accounts for the decrease of 5 at L2.

The proportion of female to male coaches has improved slightly since 2019.

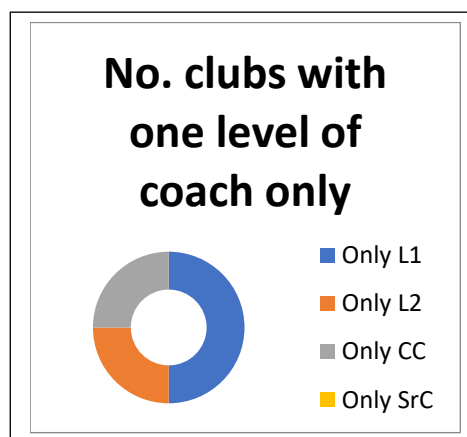
When we look at club coverage this has reduced from 2019: the total number of clubs with at least one coach is now 37 down from last year's 46. Most clubs that have only one level of coach have primarily L1 – as you would expect. This still leaves a gap of L2 and above to enable archers to progress within the sport. It is good to see the increase of County Coaches as this is the key grade to support archers moving into higher levels of performance at county level and above.

Looking at the spread across the four areas of Yorkshire, we have certainly increased as we wanted to in the East and North though the South and West have decreased. This may be partially due to lack of facilities for courses in some areas and also coaches moving clubs.

Coach education

During the year there have been courses completed successfully at L1, L2 and County Coach. The areas we wished to target in 2018-19 have grown in number and strength. There are regular venues for courses in Huddersfield, Driffield and York with occasional use of venues in Barnsley and Keighley. This gives good coverage across the county to make courses more accessible.

As CCO I am still not getting information through from many courses either in the planning stages, which should happen, or in completion – hence we have coaches coming for renewal that I have no knowledge of except for their name and club on the AGB spreadsheet. This makes several things difficult – planning courses so they don't overlap, directing enquiries to planned courses, communication with coaches post qualification and ensuring coaches know about the payment they can receive on qualification. It would be very helpful if course organisers could assist with this.

On a similar note, where we have coaches move from another area into the county, unless they contact me to tell me, they can remain unseen until renewal time. There is no obligation for clubs to "register" them and it can be frustrating for both the CCO and the coach who feels ignored in terms of any communication.

Performance coaching

There is probably much more going on in the county than I know about however Martin Holtby has been active in the East coast clubs and into Lincolnshire supporting archers and coach development; Andy Arnold has been running the Trinity coaching group supported by a number of the county's coaches, Bev Detoef is running a regular junior development group at Aire Valley venues and a group of coaches is delivering performance programmes for both juniors and seniors at Arrowhawks led by myself. There are currently 17 juniors and 15 seniors attending regularly throughout the year. One junior, Max Oakley, secured a place on the AGB Academy at Lilleshall and now attends there for his coaching and we have 5 on NTDP.

Arrowhawks has now started to run the AGB National Talent Development Programme at York with 10 archers from the Northern region attending the first session. Interest has already increased for the next session in April.

National developments

We have now seen the last courses on the "old" L1 and L2 as any courses being registered now for delivery after April will be on the new programmes. Many coaches from the county attended the briefing on the new courses and coach development opportunities, with myself as one of the "early adopter" group of coaches selected to complete accreditation and start delivery across the country in this first year.

AGM2020/8/2 Judge Liaison Officer (SPOC) – Karen Hunt

Written Report received.

I would like to say a big thank you to all the Yorkshire Judges for their continued hard work, commitment and team work as

they do an excellent job not only judging but also with keeping up to date with rule changes and promoting judging to all. Congratulations go to John Fell and Paul Dean who passed both their written and practical assessment and were upgraded to county judges. John Fell has since gone on to pass his written regional exam. Ian Helliwell and Bev Detoef joined the Yorkshire judging team as candidate judges last year and Ian has since passed his written county exam. Richard Ford (Regional judge) is currently taking a year's sabbatical. Both Martin Middleton (Regional judge) and Paul Ballard (candidate judge) took the decision to resign after taking a sabbatical from judging. I have informed the regional JLO of my intention to resign from judging at the end of this year. This currently leaves Yorkshire with 10 qualified judges and 2 candidate judges. The breakdown is as follows:-

National – 2

Regional – 5 (includes 1 on sabbatical)

County – 3

Candidate - 2

In 2019 all YAA tournaments were covered with Yorkshire judges with the exception of the YAA Field tournament where 2 out of county judges had to be used. The 2020 YAA and NCAS tournament request form went out in September 2019 and all are covered with the exception of a reserve judge for the YAA WA weekend in July. As yet I have no date for the YAA Field tournament.

I was unable to cover 3 club tournaments with Yorkshire judges in 2019– 2 field and 1 target, and again out of county judges had to be used. Finding judges for field tournaments in Yorkshire continues to be a problem and I would like to express my thanks to Julie Coates for her hard work in organising out of county judges for Yorkshire Field events.

Due to the change in the judges shirt introduced in 2019, AGB have agreed to provide one free shirt to all judges, however some judges are yet to receive their free shirt from AGB as there are issues with certain sizes not being available. The NCAS JLO is currently liaising with AGB to try and resolve this issue as at the end of this year the old judging shirts will be obsolete. The judges voucher scheme overall went well and all judges seemed to be happy with the voucher choices.

Mark thanked Karen for the work she has done over the last few years as JLO/SPOC, as she has already stated that she will not be standing for re-election as JLO/SPOC. It was reported that AGB have now changed to a different supplier for the Judge polo shirt.

AGM2020/8/3 Junior Officer – Helen Woodcock

Written Report received.

The sessions provided for the juniors at Pennine Archers have again proved popular and have included a variety of activities aimed at helping the juniors to develop their archery and related skills and to understand areas where they may need further support. There has been an increase in both the numbers attending and the clubs represented. Attempts to arrange for some of the sessions at other clubs didn't work out this year but we will continue discussions and try to make this happen in 2020/21. We have also tried to involve coaches from other clubs and, whilst some have become involved, this is something we wish to develop further.

The Postal competition has continued to develop with entries from 37 juniors from 12 clubs across the county, up from 29 juniors and 6 clubs last year. Scores have also been sent on to the NCAS Postal League organiser. Both of these postal competitions will conclude in March and certificates will be awarded to section winners.

The badges presented to the juniors at the outdoor championships were well received and these have been ordered for the indoor tournament. The background colour will be changed each year to represent the different colours on the target face.

I have had some information from Joanne Proctor, NCAS Junior Officer about a proposed Inter-regional match with WMAS and EMAS to be held in September. We are asked to send scores for our best 3 boy and girl compound and recurve archers but I don't, currently, have any criteria either for this or how the final selections will be made. I suggest we use a similar selection process as for the Inter-counties match but asking that Metric scores are included as this will be the round(s) shot and will liaise with the YAA Team Selector on this. I will also request further information on the final selection procedure to ensure that YAA juniors are not disadvantaged.

AGM2020/8/4 Public Relations Officer – Simon Slater

Written Report received.

Good news, we have now broken the 400 mark in likes with 411 people and 447 followers, a good increase from the Jan number

Recent biggest single post reach was 1200 people in Sept 2019 with the story on Joe Fairburn & Megan Tinker heading off to Slovenia with the GB team for the world field champs

Events are set up for all of the Outdoor shoots this year apart from the Longbow Champs which I hope to get sorted shortly. Please to see more 'contributors' using the page to promote and inform people on social media, with Mark Tinker using the page to good effect to gauge interest in a Field Open day at DVAC.

Again I would welcome any suggestions for cross liking the page, as this is a good way of promoting the YAA page on Facebook with other suitable Archery related pages.

AGM2020/8/5 Target Tournament Organiser – Andrew Neal

Written Report received.

The year started with the 2019 Indoor Championships which having been reduced to 2 details in the morning and 3 in the afternoon was full, bar 1 space.

The 2020 Indoor Championships is to take place tomorrow, again 2/3 details, the shoot full 4 weeks ago. Very few compound archers though.

The annual YAA weekend shoots took place in June and July at the Wetherby Grange Park venue.

The first weekend that includes the Lez Newsome Metrics day and the County Championships saw an increase on the Championship day compared with 2018 again with a healthy number of juniors. The Lez Newsome day was much the same as 2018.

The July weekend saw us again put on the Metric weekend, with a single WA1440 and a Double 720. The numbers were a little up on the 2018 shoot and it was again well received the Sunday WA720 shot in 1 detail.

The outlook for the 2020 outdoor weekends is good with entries already coming in, with us adding the new WA50 for Barebows at the Metric Weekend.

2020 sees Yorkshire host the Regional shoots with the Grand Northern at Wetherby, Intercounties at York and the Indoor at Sheffield.

I would again like to thank all those that have been involved in the shoots, and make the usual plea for more helpers to ensure these weekends run smoothly.

Saturday saw the World Archery clout and metric clout rounds on a sunny day with a light breeze. Allan Shuker was Lord Parton for the weekend and the judges on the day were Allan Shuker, Karen Hunt, Paul Dean, 6 tassel awards were claimed on the day.

The YAA Senior and Junior Clout Championships took place on the Sunday with the traditional AGB clout rounds shot in challenging wind on a sunny day. The judging team for the day was Allan Shuker, Mark Hayes and Paul Dean with a single tassel claimed.

Following the shooting and raffle the prizegiving took place in the clubhouse with visitor and Yorkshire awards being presented. I would like to thank the volunteers who gave up their Friday to help with the field set up and also Allan, Karen and Paul for carrying out their duties over the weekend. I would also like to thank Archers of East Riding for use of their excellent venue and for organising catering for the weekend.

The results were published the following week on the YAA website and the necessary paperwork was returned to ADB and the tassel award organiser.

AGM2020/8/7 Field Championship Organiser – Mark Tinker

Written Report received.

The Yorkshire Championships in 2019 were held over a very wet weekend in October. It was testament to the field party from Dearne Valley who worked tirelessly over the weekend to ensure the shoot went ahead. There were 18 Yorkshire archers competing for the county title, with no juniors. There was only 1 junior entrant (non-YAA) across the two day open competition.

Wharfe Valley Archers held their first tournament in 2019 and a new field course in the region is always welcome. In 2020 they will be hosting the English Field Championships so is a good opportunity for Yorkshire archers to compete at a high-level tournament on their doorstep.

Dearne Valley will be hosting the Northern County Championships as well as the Yorkshire Championships for 2020 - another good opportunity for Yorkshire archers.

Dearne Valley will also be holding a field Archery workshop on May the 10th. The workshop is aimed particularly at those new to field archery but will also benefit anyone wishing to improve their field craft. Several experienced field archers,

including GB internationals, will be on hand to share their wisdom and expertise. Cost is £5 seniors and £1 juniors which is the standard day-rate at DVAC. While there was a lot of interest in the event before the dates were published, there has been very little take-up since, so please sign-up to ensure it goes ahead.
